

## Home Learning Support - Reading



Read a variety of books at home and listen to your child read their school reading books.  
 Engage in a reading activity every day, which could include reading a book aloud, reading on your own, sharing a book with an adult or listening to a story.  
 Keep a diary to log all the reading that you have done.  
 Keep up to date with what is happening in the world or find out more about topics that interest you by watching Newsround. What did you find out? Is there anything that you need more help with understanding? What else might you want to find out? Do some of your own research.

Complete the linked play activities for each book.  Ask your child which books they would like to read. Talk about the story and ask questions to check understanding.  <b>Rumplestiltskin</b> –  Create and illustrate your own storybook.</p> <p>Talk about the meaning of unfamiliar words when reading and encourage your child to ask questions about words which they do not understand.  Make a list of new and interesting words, along with a definition. Can you write the word within a sentence?</p> <p><b>Inference</b> - Discuss clues within stories that help your child to read between the lines and draw sensible conclusions about what is happening. Ask your child questions starting with why? to encourage explanation.  <b>Prediction</b> - Stop at regular points in reading and make a prediction about what could happen, using what you already know. Write your predictions down and see if you are right.</p> <p>Access previous Reading SATs Papers, along with mark schemes.  Access reading assessment papers.
