**1. Welcome, Introductions and Apologies**

Zara welcomed everyone to the meeting. Emily announced apologies from Mr Dickinson and representatives from AMD, CTA, WPA and WEA.

**2. Review of the Previous Minutes**

The minutes were accepted as an accurate record of the previous meeting.

**3. Wakefield Theatre Royal**

The Theatre will be booked for February/March time 2020. MP's shared ideas of what they would like to perform. Singing, dancing, acting/drama and songs from different decades were suggested. Another idea was to act a scene from a play, for example, Shakespeare or a Disney theme. A suggestion was made that the theme could be Roald Dahl (for the younger children), combining acting and singing.

<p><b>4. Primary School Enterprise Challenge</b></p> <p>Paul Robson from Primary School Enterprise Challenge attended the meeting. The 'Primary School Enterprise Challenge' is a full enterprise programme open to full year groups aimed at years 3, 4, 5 and 6. Working in teams the children work on real life business challenges, which are set by real businesses. Helping to develop enterprise and employability skills of all the young learners who take part.</p> <p><u>Project Radio Enterprise Challenge.</u> The challenge would be to create an hour long radio show from start to finish. The task would involve, creating logos, advertising for local businesses and presentations. Covering a wide range of subject areas including English, Maths, Business, Drama, Art and Design. The winning team would be invited to attend a finals day.</p> <p>The project could be tailored to the Trust and each schools requirements.</p> <p><b>ACTION: MP's to take back to schools and to discuss and share with Headteachers.</b></p>	
<p><b>5. Art Network – Ideas for a New Theme</b></p> <p>The art tour will continue in the next academic year, producing the work in the summer term. It was agreed that the focus would be linked to plastic pollution, MP's discussed that they would like champion such a charity.</p>	
<p><b>6. Parliament 2019 – Hub Discussion</b></p> <p>Mr Bishop explained that there is currently twelve schools in the Trust and during the next academic year, Churchfield Primary School in Barnsley, will be joining the Trust making thirteen schools in total.</p> <p>It is yet to be decided whether the Parliament meetings will be split into two hubs or will continue to be a single Parliament. The first meeting will be held in the new academic year as one single Parliament and shortly after that a decision will be made.</p>	
<p><b>7. Thanks and Appreciation</b></p> <p>Emily and Zara gave their thanks and appreciation. Mr Bishop wished good luck to all Year 6 pupils moving on from their Primary schools and best wishes to Year 2 pupils moving up from Infant School.</p> <p>Mr Bishop gave thanks to Emma for being Prime Minister and announced Nicolas as next year's Prime Minister.</p>
